

The King has finally returned home but much has changed in his kingdom since he left to fight in the Trojan war. His beloved wife Penelope (Binoche) is now a prisoner in her own home, hounded by her many ambitious suitors to choose a new husband, a new king. Their son Telemachus, who has grown up fatherless, is facing death at the hands of the suitors who see him as an obstacle in their relentless pursuit of Penelope and the kingdom. Odysseus has changed too. Scarred by his experience of war, he is no longer the mighty warrior his people remember. But he is forced to face his past in order to rediscover the strength needed to save his family and win back the love he has lost.





Someplace in Your Mouth is shot in Forum car park on the edge of Palermo. Young men sit on bouncing mopeds; cars overloaded with sub-woofers pound with base. The camera registers male posture. But it also captures moments of being together, of unspoken courtship, of physical and sonic encounter. A voiceover reads a poem by American writer Magdalena Zarawski, from which the film takes its title. The tight four stanzas, translated into Italian, pull the listener in. Its fleshy tones and disarming syntax feels its way through the sublime, the bodily and the ecstatic.

The meeting of Zarawski's poem, images of Sicilian sub-culture and found footage of wheelies and races is both unlikely and tender; their different worlds, and forms, becoming strange and close.





Italy, 1980s–1990s. With his agency Diva Futura, Riccardo Schicchi revolutionises mass culture by turning the hippie utopia of free love into a new phenomenon: porn. Under his guidance, "girls next door" Ilona Staller, Moana Pozzi, Eva Henger and many others suddenly become world-famous stars and enter Italian homes thanks to the boom of private TVs and VCRs. "Pornstar," a word coined at the time, marks the beginning of a new era.

The media impact is so overwhelming that it leads to the election to Parliament of Ilona Staller, known as "Cicciolina," the birth of the Partito dell'Amore, and Moana Pozzi's running for mayor of Rome.

The adventure of this big "family"—which sets off jealousies, ordeals and contradictions that leave the pornography industry in shambles—is told through the eyes of Debora, a young secretary at the agency with a mortgage to worry about. All this happened because of desires as private as they were widespread: the ones everybody had.



These are the years of the First World War and Dr. Stefano Zorzi spends his days in the Exemption Clinic in a large city of Northern Italy, where he not only takes care of soldiers who arrive from the massacre of the front, but also he fights simulation and self-harm of those who hope to be dispensed, by sending them before the Military Court. Stefano would never have thought of meeting someone capable of deliberately procuring a pathology, as one procures a lifeboat to save himself from greater evil. But now he's tired of that conflict that made him an inspector and, if necessary, a gendarme. In the apartment of a secluded building, Dr. Giulio Farradi works. A restless man, deeply opposed to war, capable to feel a tender and possessive love for the soldiers of his 'private war'. If Stefano, in fact, does his utmost to heal soldiers and send them back to fight, Giulio makes them ill, or helps them to self-injure seriously enough to be exonerated.

The two doctors, who went to university together and were great friends, they not only (secretly) challenge each other on a professional level, but also on the sentimental one: they are both linked to Anna, a courageous nurse with a strong character. But when the great 'Spanish' fever epidemic arrived in 1918, the time for love, politics and science ends up getting confused dangerously...

A man spends peacefully his days in hospital without too many worries. He has been hospitalized for a while but that condition seems like the best way to live his life, safe from everything and everyone, without responsibilities and problems of any kind. It feels really good in there and even if some of his ward companions feel trapped, for them he can also feel free like nowhere else. That precious routine runs smoothly until a new person is admitted to the same ward. She is a restless, angry companion, she accepts nothing of that condition, especially the unwritten rules. She is not willing to wait, she wants to leave that place better or even worse. She wants to live as she should or die, as happens to those who end up in there. He is overwhelmed by that fury, first trying to defend himself and then accepting something incomprehensible. That encounter will help him accept that if you choose to truly face your heart and your emotions, there is no possible repair.
